INVESTING IN A SAFE REOPENING FOR CANADA

OUR \$19 BILLION SAFE RESTART AGREEMENT

Overcoming this pandemic is a Team Canada effort, and we are working with all levels of government to ensure our economy reopens safely, carefully, and prepared. Our Liberal government's **Safe Restart Agreement is a \$19 Billion commitment** to support the provinces and territories as the Canadian economy recovers. You told us what matters most, and your feedback helped our government set seven key priorities for this funding:

- 1. Ensuring parents have access to safe and accessible childcare.
- 2. Securing PPE for workers and businesses.
- 3. Guaranteeing a minimum of 10 paid sick days for workers.
- 4. Improving testing and contact-tracing for COVID-19.
- 5. Supporting vital municipal services and safe public transit.
- 6. Providing better living conditions for seniors in longterm care facilities.
- 7. Investing in healthcare services such as mental health and homelessness.



SUPPORTING A SAFE RETURN TO SCHOOL

Facing this new school year, I know many parents in Erin Mills have expressed concerns about the safety of students and faculty. In the uncertainty of this pandemic, our schools should be properly prepared and equipped for the challenges ahead. Our Liberal government is listening, and we stepped in to help with the **Safe Return to Class Fund**.



This new fund is providing \$2 billion to support health and safety measures as our schools reopen. For Ontario, we are delivering more than \$736 million to provide cleaning supplies, personal protective equipment, better air ventilation in classrooms, hand sanitizing stations, and other important measures.

We know education and schools are a provincial responsibility, which is why this funding will flow through regional governments to work with local school boards. We are taking action because we don't want to take any unnecessary risks for our children, our families, and hard-working teachers in our communities.

FEDERAL SUPPORT FOR COVID-19 RESPONSE PROJECTS

Our government is stepping in to provide additional resources for our communities through the new **COVID-19 Resilience stream**. This stream supports smaller-scale provincial and municipal projects that respond to COVID-19 with expanded eligibility for projects, flexible terms, and a faster approval process. We are doing our part to ensure Canadians are protected over the coming months and **committed over \$3 billion towards**:

Upgrades and retrofits to schools, hospitals,and Indigenous buildings

Measures to promote physical distancing and other COVID-19 response infrastructure

Parks, trails, bike paths, and other active transportation projects

Disaster mitigation and adaptation against flooding, fires, and more

LOCAL INVESTMENTS FOR MISSISSAUGA-ERIN MILLS

- We made an historic housing investment in Peel Region: \$276 million to create up to 2,240 rental units and shelter beds!
- We have delivered over \$232,000 through the Emergency Community Support Fund to fund local organizations such as The Salvation Army Erin Mills, Eden Food for Change, and Ivan Franko Homes that are supporting residents in our riding throughout this pandemic.
- We provided funding through the **New Horizons for Seniors Program** to fantastic local groups including **Feng Hua Seniors**, **Vedanta Cultural Foundation**, and **Unison Senior Organization**to provide services for seniors in our community.
- We created **281 quality summer jobs** for youth in Erin Mills this summer through the **Canada Summer Jobs Program.**

EXPANDED SUPPORTS FOR CANADIANS

- In July, 6.5 million Canadian seniors received a onetime boost of \$300 to their Old Age Security and \$200 to their Guaranteed Income Supplement.
- We have extended the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy until November, and expanded eligibility to allow a wider range of businesses to access support. Over the last few months, our 75% wage subsidy has supported over 281,000 Canadian employers and protected up to 3.1 million jobs.
- This fall, we are delivering a tax-free boost of up to \$600 for over 1 million Canadians receiving the Disability Tax Credit.
