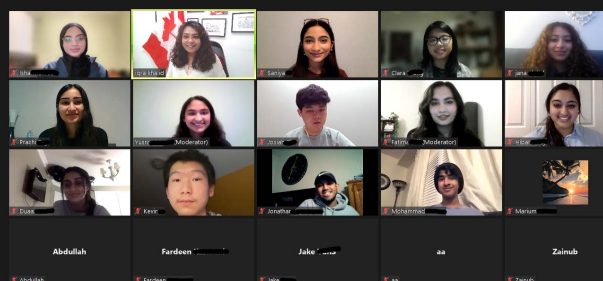

22 BUDGET ITEMS FOR MISSISSAUGA-ERIN MILLS

NUMBERS

- 5. \$85M to launch a new Anti-Racism Strategy and a National Action Plan on Combatting Hate
- 6. \$5.6M to support the Special Envoy on Preserving Holocaust Remembrance and Combatting Antisemitism
- 7. \$5.6M to support the new Special Representative on Combatting Islamophobia
- 8. \$593M to support the new National Action Plan on Gender-based Violence
- 9. \$603.2M over five years to build more efficient and resilient supply chains
- 10. Introducing a one-time 15% tax on financial institutions that made significant profits in 2021
- 11. Increase the tax rate for large banking and insurance groups by 10%
- 12. \$50M additional funding to support recovery in the arts and cultural sectors
- 13. \$272.6M to support an employment strategy for persons with disabilities.
- 14. \$20M to provide more local supports for seniors through the New Horizons for Seniors program
- 15. \$30M to support research into Dementia, aging, and brain health
- 16. \$45.2B to expand our healthcare capacity through the Canada Health Transfer
- 17. \$6.1B over five years to increase the capabilities of the Canadian Armed forces
- 18. \$875M to support measures that will better defend Canada from cyber threats
- 19. \$1.2B in additional humanitarian aid and weapons support to Ukraine
- 20. \$625M to build more early learning and childcare facilities and infrastructure
- 21. \$573M over 5 years to improve Immigration and Citizenship services
- 22. \$4B to support housing for Indigenous Communities

1. Take Action on Housing Affordability



- Help you save up to \$40K with a tax-free First Home Savings Account
- End blind-bidding, ban foreign buyers, and address other predatory practices with a Home Buyers' Bill of Rights
- Double the first-time home buyers' tax credit to \$10,000
- Create 100,000 new housing units through a new Housing Accelerator Fund
- Support the construction of new co-op housing projects with \$1.5B

2. Deliver Dental Care for Canadians



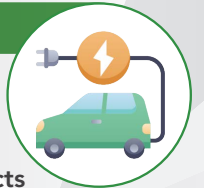
- We will deliver dental coverage over the next 4 years for Canadians with a family income less than \$90K, and **no co-pays for those making under \$70K**
- 2022 → Age 12 and under**
- 2023 → Seniors, and youth under 18**
- 2025 → All Canadians**

3. Support Canadian Businesses and Workers



- Enhance the Canada Workers Benefit to provide up to \$24,000 more for couples making minimum wage
- Extend the small business tax rate (9%) up to a taxable capital of under \$50M
- Create a new Labour Mobility Deduction to cover up to \$4000/year in eligible expenses for tradespersons and apprentices
- Expand the Foreign Credentials Recognition program to help 11,000 foreign-trained healthcare workers per year start working in the field

4. Make Electric Vehicles More Accessible



- Support inter-provincial clean energy projects with \$250M over 4 years
- A new purchase incentive program for medium- and heavy-duty ZEVs
- Invest in additional renewable energy and grid modernization projects
- Support critical minerals projects in Canada to increase production on Canadian-made electric vehicles and batteries
- Continue building a national network of charging stations

WHAT ISSUES MATTER MOST TO YOU?

Diplomatic Mission to South Asia

In April, I was honoured to join Canada's Minister of Foreign Affairs, Hon. Melanie Joly, for a diplomatic mission to South Asia.

We travelled to Jakarta, Indonesia and Hanoi, Vietnam to meet with the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN), Foreign Affairs Ministers, and the Prime Minister of Vietnam to continue building a strong relationship between our nations. We also spoke with human rights workers and met with farmers and representatives from numerous industries. It was an productive trip and one that will help us continue to build Canada's Indo-Pacific Strategy and open up new markets for Canadian products.



Honouring a Local Trailblazer

On International Women's Day, as we celebrated women who broke barriers, I rose in the House of Commons to recognize Marian Coveny. She was a trailblazing hockey player, captain, and teacher at Loyola Catholic School. She was a fierce competitor who led Team Canada to victory in the first-ever Women's World Hockey Tournament in 1987. I rose to speak about her incredible contributions to Canada, her passing, and her enduring legacy in our community.



Housing Affordability

Housing affordability was already an issue when our government was elected in 2015, which is why we brought forward a National Housing Strategy that has already built and repaired over 174,500 housing units. We know that there is still more work to be done, and that is what we successfully advocated for in Budget 2022. In May, I rose in the House to highlight our progress, the next steps in our plan to tackle predatory real estate practices, and to call on the provinces to come to the table and do their part.



Indigenous Reconciliation

One year ago, many Canadians across the country realized how little we truly understood about the harm caused to Indigenous peoples of this land. Our government has made significant progress in fulfilling the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's calls to action, and there is still much more work to be done. I rose in the House to talk about creating a spaces for all types of Indigenous stories to be told, and the importance of reconciliation for all generations of Canadians.



Committee Updates

This term, I am honoured to serve as Vice-Chair on the Standing Committee on Access to Information, Privacy and Ethics (ETHI), where we are studying important issues such as facial recognition technology and the privacy of Canadians. I will also be continuing my role as a member of the National Security and Intelligence Committee of Parliamentarians (NSICOP). There is a lot of important work ahead and I look forward to sharing updates as we proceed.
